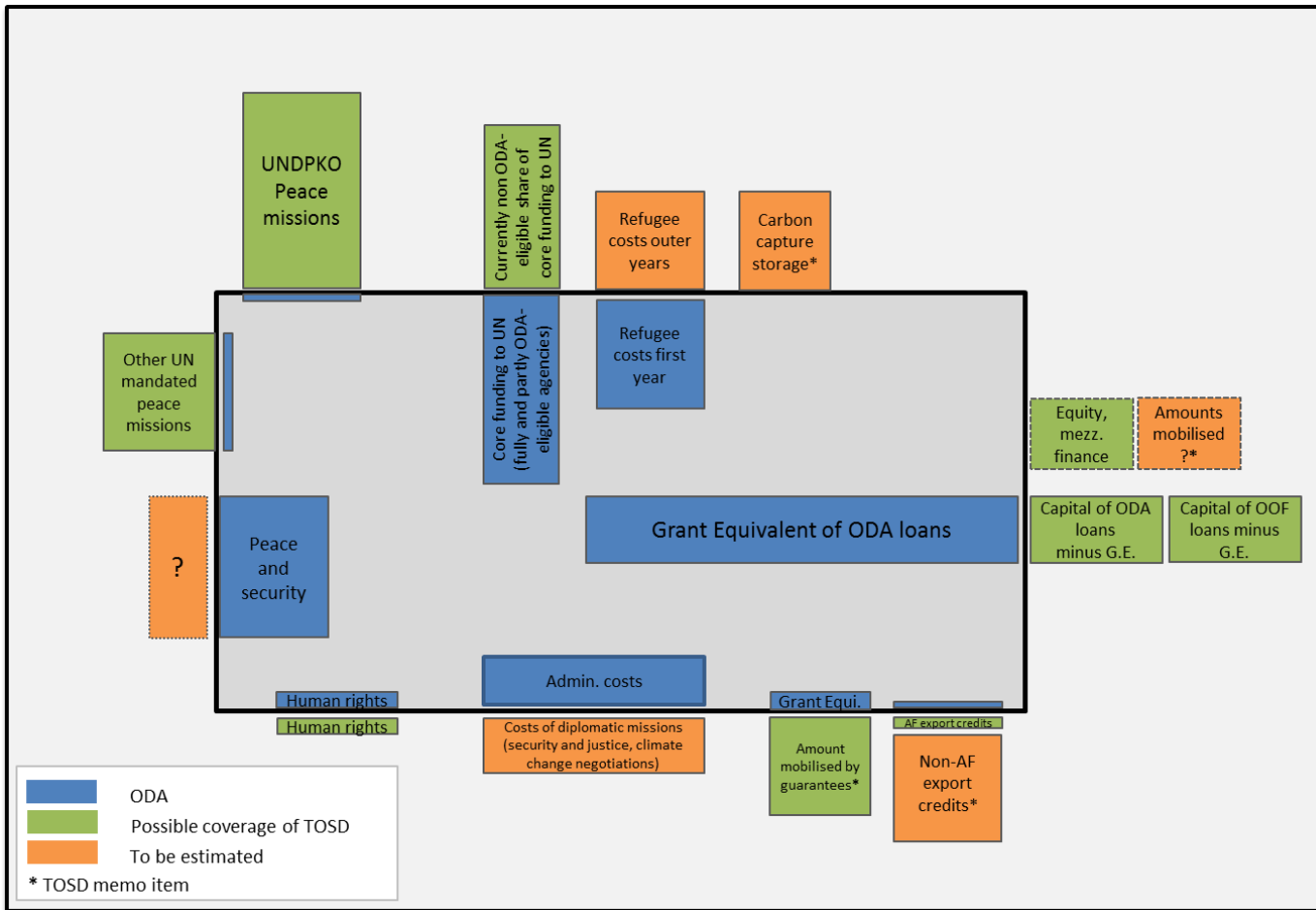

Definition and categorisation of IFD mechanisms in the post-2015 framework

Definition

- Need for an agreed IFD definition to be able to track amounts mobilised by IFD in the post-2015 framework and properly valorise efforts by the public sector

Categorisation

- Innovative **sourcing** vs. innovative **spending**
- Public vs. Private
- Sub-classification proposed needs further work



Innovative financing and climate change

- Global nature of climate change needs global solutions.
- Multi-stakeholder mechanisms fit for the purpose.
- Innovative mechanisms used in the health sector could be replicated; focus should be put in those mechanisms that can be scaled-up at an international level
